

Dorit Price-Levine is a professional facilitator, mediator, and licensed attorney. Incorporating her expertise in Transformative Mediation and Non-Violent Communication, Dorit has led communications skill-building workshops for over 15 years at over one hundred institutions. These include workplaces, houses of worship, university campuses, and professional networks. Previously a Senior Associate at the Consensus Building Institute and former Deputy Director of Resetting the Table, Dorit supports groups to skillfully engage across differences, convenes public meetings that shape state and federal policy, and designs and facilitates multi-stakeholder decision-making processes.

Dorit's recent work includes Speaking Across Differences Skills Training Workshops for Students, Faculty, and Staff at universities across the country in the context of polarizing protest movements on campuses nationwide. She has facilitated several Task Forces for Jewish non profit organizations which include dialogue, assessment, and recommendations for organizational stances on Israel and Palestine. She designed and facilitated a dialogue process in Nevada City County on whether the county would issue a Gaza/Israel Ceasefire Statement. Dorit designed and facilitated community processes in Northern California on regulation for CCS (Carbon Capture and Storage) Technology. She leads Speaking Across Differences Skills Training Workshops for Students, Faculty, and Staff at universities, with heightened sensitivity since the events of October 7th and the ensuing protests on campuses nationwide. She is currently facilitating a year-long Bridging Fellowship at UC Berkeley for a diverse cohort of undergraduate students, including Israelis and Palestinians. Dorit is also currently engaged in a process for LA County, conducting interviews that will culminate in Speaking Across Conflict Workshops for the Public Defender and Fire Department.

Dorit spent years living in Palestine and Israel working in peacebuilding and human rights. She has lived elsewhere in the Middle East, including Egypt and Lebanon. Dorit has working knowledge of Hebrew, Spanish, and Arabic. She holds a JD from the UC Berkeley School of Law and a B.A. in Political Science and Near Eastern Studies from the University of Pennsylvania.
